







- Participatory approach and community engagement is key in achieving results and create creative and resilient communities
- <u>Bottom-up</u> approach is crucial, but also requires engagement from the public sector (EU, national, local)
- There are many <u>diverse and creative solutions</u> (no one-size-fits-all solution)
- Many initiatives show that <u>individualism is over</u> <u>everything is about community</u>







- <u>Digitalisation should be used as a tool to provide</u> access to new and inclusive opportunities (skills development and capacity building are necessary)
- Communities should work as a <u>network</u>, <u>within the</u> <u>community</u>, <u>between communities and with experts</u>







- <u>Simplicity, flexibility, less formal approaches, fast</u> <u>solutions</u> (no duplication of plans, initiatives, structures, layers)
- Starting from small ideas to a larger scale
- Good governance means having the right actors at the right place, to develop a right list of priorities, involving local communities and identify proper funding







- Smart Village concept benefits from <u>synergies</u> and plays a <u>complementary role</u> with other existing initiatives or instruments (such as LEADER)
- Agile and simple integration between funding opportunities
- Administrative setup should be <u>simplified and</u> <u>streamlined</u>
